Vicar's Letter

ear Friends

There is so much conflict in the world. We've recently watched the different factions in Syria try to find an agreed way forwards; the same need is there for South Sudan, for Israel and Palestine, for the two Koreas, and so many places. Often, a mediator can help. Perhaps an independent third

party may help both sides to agree a series of compromises.



Ultimately, all of our conflicts trace back to the biggest feud: We and God do not agree who is in charge of this world. When we all start thinking we are gods in our own domains, it's no wonder we fall out with one another. When our lives overlap, which of us is going to be "god"?

Easter is the story of the most wonderful mediator in history. In 1 Timothy 2:5, Jesus is called the "one mediator between God and people".

Only, he's a mediator of a very different kind. Warring parties today need to find a mediator who is independent, so that both sides can find some suitable compromises. If each side is willing to let go of some of their demands, is there middle ground that everyone can accept?

Jesus is the opposite of independent; he represents *both* sides! He is both man and God. He also did not broker a compromise. That would have meant persuading God to have less exacting moral standards, and making us a little more obedient in key ways. The reverse was so: He solved the rift without reducing God's demands, and without requiring our increased obedience.

No human has ever been in harmony with God like Jesus was. What he did was exchange places with us. For three hours on the cross, he became us – at war with God. As a result, all who accept this gift can become him – at peace with God, not just for three hours but forever. He could only end our hostility with God in this way because he's not independent. Only a human being could swap places with other humans like us. And only because Jesus is God could he love us like this; otherwise, God would have been picking on an innocent bystander.

The reconciliation worked – the empty tomb on Easter morning is our proof.

And so Jesus is the mediator like no other. He ended hostilities between us and God. No wonder we celebrate Easter – it's such good news. Do join us this year – our service times are inside this copy of *The Well*.

However, there are still a minority of dog owners who continue to allow their dogs to foul without clearing up. Please bear in mind that when you are caught, you may be facing a fine of up to £1,000 under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996.

HELP OUR CHILDREN SWIM INTO THE FUTURE

Kemsing School has been fortunate enough to have its own pool since it was built in 1961 and the current corrugated roof added in 1967. It was the local community, along with the school's Parent & Teacher Association (PTA), who originally paid for and physically built the pool and later the roof, in response to a local drowning accident.



The swimming pool is highly valued by the school and over the years there has been continued investment in maintenance of this fantastic resource and the pool itself is in good condition; however, due to age and condition of the roof structure it is becoming increasingly difficult to maintain it to a safe standard. Unless this is addressed and the corrugated roof replaced it is increasingly likely that the pool will no longer be usable as a result of being unsafe and would have to close.

In order to save the pool, our plan is to remove the current failing roof structure and changing rooms, to be replaced with a modern roof enclosure which would encompass the pool, changing areas, shower, WC and storage facilities in one structure. By encompassing it all under the one roof it not only becomes more cost effective to run but also a much more pleasant and accessible environment for the pupils, and hopefully other community groups, to use.

The estimated total cost for this project is £85,000-£90,000

We have applied for a grant from Sport England for £40,000 towards the costs of the new enclosure, which is currently under their consideration and we should find out if this has been successful in the next couple of months. However, the grant money is not guaranteed and therefore we are asking our community for help again.

The school and PTA are committed to keeping the pool open and have prioritised the Swimming Pool Fund for fund raising activities in 2013/2014; with £28,000 raised to date.


We will also be launching a **Buy-A-Tile** initiative where <u>pupils</u>, <u>parents</u>, <u>grandparents</u>, <u>relatives</u>, <u>neighbours</u>, <u>teachers or anyone in the community</u> can have a 'digital' photo tile with an image themselves or a family member which will be included in a mural in the new swimming pool enclosure; a lasting legacy of the community support for the swimming pool project.

There will also be the opportunity for <u>local businesses</u> to **Buy-A-Tile** and have their name included in the mural as supporters of the school's swimming pool project.

am sure that most of you know by now that the refurbishment of Woodlands Church Hall is almost complete. The Hall Fund was started in the year 2000 and we thank God for the wonderful way that everything suddenly



came together after the 2013 Woodlands Fete. The significant amount raised at the fete, proceeds from Woodlands Café and other events, together with grants and generous donations have all contributed to making the refurbishment a reality.

At the time of writing we had hoped that the Hall would have reopened but as with most major works there is always more to do than is at first obvious. Contingency funds have been used to pay for unforeseen plumbing problems and timber treatment. The stainless steel worktops in the kitchen could not be made until after Christmas, delaying further work such as tiling. We are therefore seeking additional funding to enable us to improve the lighting and cupboard space in the Hall. NEWS FROM ST. CLERE ESTATE: It's raining *Inside....*

About five years ago, I went to a Historic Houses Association conference about energy use in historic houses. The message from the conference was that weather would become more 'eventful'. Wetter rain. Dryer dry spells etc. The point was that we should get prepared, belt and braces, investing in the infrastructure necessary to cope with such events. On an estate like St Clere 'getting prepared' takes a huge investment, and it isn't something that can be gone into lightly; failing to act is sometime more expensive still.

First, we looked at the energy use across the estate to keep warm in cold times. Every pound spent on keeping heat IN, is worth at least two pounds paying for heating. So, loft insulation, window repairs, door seals and finally individual radiator thermostats which stopped un-used rooms at the top of the house being kept at a sauna heat because the system was trying to heat the drafty high ceilinged ground floor rooms.

Next, create energy. We now have our own beloved wood-chip boiler which has caused more problems than all my children put together, but now finally works, and we produce all our own chip and one day, in about 10-15 years, it will pay us back. In the meantime I have to enjoy the benefit to my conscience, rather than the bank account. We put in ground source heating at the cottage we restored in the walled garden, and hope to put another woodchip boiler at West Yaldham if we get planning for a development there. Finally, we are considering a field mounted solar panel site. We've found a site that we think can only be seen by one or two houses from their top floor, as it runs between the motorway and the railway line to the west of Chaucer. The best guess is that this will supply enough clean electricity for the whole of the Estate, plus a further 6000 or more homes in Kemsing.

After the winter and spring of 2013 I thought we'd seen the wettest we could get. Halfway up the North Downs and surely flooding shouldn't be a problem at St Clere? But it looks like 2014 will be even wetter. Last year the wet was felt most keenly in the farm, with some crops being abandoned because we couldn't get tractors onto fields without sinking. This year the house is bearing the brunt. The brickwork is saturated, so now when the wind and rain blows onto the house, the water blows through the bricks and it rains inside. Doors and windows are swelling all around the estate, and nothing can be done about any of it until things dry out. And when it does dry out, we'll be ready. We have our own water supply; we found the old underground water storage tank and now capture and use our own rainwater, and have come off the mains.

The weather last summer was so glorious that we forgave the miserable spring. We're hoping that this miserable winter means this summer will be as good as last year. We've got the garden open on 15th June for NGS and Sevenoaks Shakespeare Society are performing Twelfth Night (we'll be giving our proceeds to Breast Cancer Care) from 1st - 6th July. As long as the weather stays fair for those, and the various weddings and events we're hosting this year, I'll put up with the rain inside.

News from Cotmans Ash SPRINGTIME IN KEMSING

Por many reasons I enjoy the quiet solitude of these long nights of early spring - it is a time to be in the woods at sundown to hear the wood pigeons clatter into roost, a cock pheasant, his last crow of the day, a startled blackbird and the whispering chatter from the tiny gold crests who gather together for warmth in the fir trees. Rooks in evening flight with the noisy jackdaws forever arguing and shouting as they cross the sky in the last light of the day. Flights of silent wading birds that could be mallard, pochard, teal or even widgeon - not a sound do they make in the fading light.

The recent north east winds have brought in the woodcock - they leave the freezing cold of Scandinavia and eastern Europe for our milder southern woodland - a mystery to me, always turning up in the same spot - they rise from your feet like silent brown shadows. They seem to navigate in complete darkness - What do they live on? Where do they go? For they only stay a few nights.

Another marvel of spring nightfall are the tawny owls, they are the true spirit of April darkness gliding on silent wings down the woodland rides and through the tree stumps. They are ace hunters of mice and voles - I have even seen them chase bats as well as they take many worms. Through my bedroom I hear them call at all hours of the night - a mournful echoing call like some lost spirit.

Primroses are true Spring messengers of our garden county – they have somehow been pushing their rosettes of leaves and flower buds through the frozen turf of February - together with their first cousins the Cowslips, they cover the green downland with drifts of lemon yellow like some giant tablecloth.

Another spring marvel of our garden county is the bluebells, they rise from the woodland floor as a 'Dresden blue' mirage with the occasional drift of white to break it up.

The little scented woodlander is the Spurge Laurel with it's lime green trumpets opening under glossy green leaves – it is in fact a member of the Daphne family.

I am sure Heather and I won't have been the only ones who came into the New Year on the 'back foot' but we both want to thank so many of you for your cards, notes and so many other means of best wishes. Now it's our turn - the primroses and cowslips are showing enormous prospects so why not come up to Cotmans Ash around the Easter Festival.

Sevenoaks District Council has launched a new Air Alert Service, an automated service available to anyone living in Sevenoaks District who suffers from a respiratory condition including COPD or asthma.

The **FREE** service enables people to register to receive air quality alerts to give them prior notice when air quality is poor or deteriorating, which may cause tem to have breathing difficulties. This then enables them to make informed decisions about whether they should go out when they know the air quality going to be poor, close their windows or to take extra medication out with them.

Once registered the information is sent by text message, telephone voice message or email. People registered for similar services in other areas said that this has helped them to manage their symptoms and found it very useful. One GP in Devon has seen emergency hospital admissions relating to respiratory conditions reduce by up to 82%.
