

Vicar's letter

Dear Friends

As I write, we're in the middle of panic about the spread of a particular coronavirus, COVID-19, which started in Wuhan, China, and has now spread around the world. Chinese factories are suspending manufacture of items we take for granted in the West; financial markets have had several days with dramatic falls; British travellers abroad are being repatriated and quarantined.



Modern medicine is amazing. Antibiotics, blood transfusion and routine immunisations are just three developments that mean the infant mortality rate is far lower than in centuries past, and we no longer routinely die from many illnesses. However, this coronavirus has killed 2,500 people worldwide so far, and appears unchecked. The resulting sense of fear and panic is understandable. Here's an illness that our current medical advances are not able to control. Our regular feeling that we are invincible has been replaced with a feeling of great fragility.

I sincerely hope that, by the time you read this, all this will sound dated. Hopefully there will be a vaccine to cure COVID-19, another to immunise against it, infection rates will be down, and this will be well on the way to being forgotten.

It's good to pause and pay attention when something cuts through our sense that we can conquer anything. Infant mortality may have fallen since the 19th century, but the human mortality rate remains at 100%. I have no wish to be morbid; smallpox may no longer kill a single human being, but something else will eventually. Death is the universal human problem that we cannot cure. Our fear of coronavirus comes from the fact that we don't like to be reminded of our powerlessness.

This is why Easter is such amazingly good news. On April 12th this year, we will celebrate the fact that Jesus of Nazareth is a real human being who went through death and came out the other side. He rose from the dead, and was seen alive by hundreds of people on at least 10 separate occasions. The 4 gospels were written while those eyewitnesses were still around. He's still alive today. He is invincible; he has conquered death and so he can conquer anything. He invites us to trust him with our own life, and with our own death.

The Christian faith is not just a philosophy, a set of rules to live by, some ideals to prop up those who can't get by on their own. It is the good news that our deepest fear, the problem we cannot conquer ourselves, has been fully dealt with.

KEMSING LIBRARY—50th ANNIVERSARY

Kemsing Library was officially opened by Colin Cowdray, Kent and England cricketer on 1st January 1970. The Library could not let the 50th anniversary of this event go unmarked and held a series of events in the Library between 18th and 25th January 2020.



The happenings started with the judging of the great Kemsing Bake Off. Over 34 cakes, fruit cakes, sponge cakes, individual small cakes and buns, were judged by members of the Kemsing Cricket Club and the Kemsing Evening WI. The standard was extremely high, but eventually winners were announced and rosettes (in the adult classes) and Book Tokens (in the children's classes) were awarded. It was a fantastic response from the Community, and everyone enjoyed the cakes!

On Thursday Lara Maiklem gave a talk based on her book 'Mudlarking—Lost and Found on the River Thames'. She gave a fascinating insight into what could be found in a small area, but just

'getting your eye in'. Her finds included items of Roman pottery, Victorian glass bottles and small mementos. Unfortunately nowadays a Licence is required for anyone who wishes to search the river foreshore. Copies of her book are available in the Library.

On Saturday the children took part in a craft event which they all thoroughly enjoyed.

It was a wonderful way to think of our Library. Please do remember to support it, it is a marvellous resource to have in the village. Use it, don't lose it!!!

Kemsing Downs Nature Reserve

Ongoing tree maintenance work on the Reserve is planned in the next few years (starting in February 2020) due to ash dieback. Coppicing to a small section on the woodland on Whiteleaf Down will be done as part of the normal maintenance programme.

The Parish Council has successfully applied for funding via The Darent Valley Living Landscape Partnership Scheme (funded through the Heritage Lottery Fund) to implement improvements which will predominantly focus on Green Hill, The Dell and Goss Bank and will include scrub clearance, controlling dog rose and improvements to livestock handling as well as ensuring fencing remains adequate for grazing this important Local Wildlife Site. We are awaiting further information.

Common Field Recreation Ground

The Recreation Grounds Committee is considering options to improve the section of sparsely scattered trees along the bridleway and adjacent to the car park on the Southern end from Heaverham Road.

The gates to both play areas will be replaced soon.

Notice board

The old worn notice board in the village car park has been replaced.

Highways Improvements

As reported in the Autumn, the Parish Council is in the process of preparing a Highways Improvement Plan which will, when finalised and adopted by KCC, prioritise highway improvements for Kemsing.



Annual Vestry & Parochial Church Meetings

SPRING UPDATE FROM KEMSING SCHOOL

A Spring Term packed with events ensures that we arrive at this point, halfway through another academic year, and none of us can quite believe how quickly the time is passing.

Class 1 began the term learning all about the circus. After writing to persuade him to come, they hugely enjoyed a visit from Rico the Clown, who had all the children taking part in juggling, plate spinning and unicycling.

Class 4 have enjoyed a day a week of learning out in our forest environment, where they have demonstrated great independence and determination to explore their environment in the most challenging of weathers, all with a great sense of enjoyment and awe and wonder taking place. This new development to our curriculum will now see every class enjoy up to 9 weeks of time in our woodland environment every academic year. The depth of conversation and time and space for children to grow and shine in this alternative learning environment makes it an absolutely key part of any child's journey through Kemsing Primary School.

Children from Year 1 and 2 represented our school brilliantly at the Infant Agility event and children from every class took part in a January inter-school Speed Stacking event, where two Kemsing children came away with medals for finishing second in their age group. At both events, our children were a real credit to their school and village. Our netball and football teams have also competed regularly against other schools in a league competition. The footballers in particular have exemplified this term's value of positivity, by coming back from being three goals down at half time, two games running – once to achieve a draw and in the next game to achieve a remarkable win.

Class 5 have spent the last couple of weeks getting into full Bake-off mode, producing their very own show stoppers, as they have been learning how to bake bread. A basic loaf in the first week, then flavourings and own shape designs in the second ensured that associated families will have a tasty start to the half term!

Reception have spent the term learning about castles, knights and princesses, inspired by Julia Donaldson's Zog books. In addition to making their own castles and writing about their designs, the children came to school dressed as knights, dragons or princesses and all their parents were invited in to see a showcase of their children's work just before we broke up for half term last week.
